The plow is before you. Have you laid hold of it? Prophetic times are unfolding. Are you girded up in your understanding of End Time events? The Chosen People are standing upon their Biblical Inheritance, which the nations are carving out from beneath their feet. Are you properly prepared to demonstrate your love for, and your commitment to your Jewish brethren - in action and in Truth?

Project Shofar introduces its exclusive 12-day tour to the Promised Land. Inspired by Zechariah's prophecy, our Builders of Zion Hands-on Construction Tour will focus on strengthening and supporting the Remnant in the Land, providing tour-goers with evidence of Prophecy being fulfilled in this day and time, patronizing businesses that support the homesteads of Biblical Judea and Samaria, and Jewish leaders, activists, and families who are firmly and faithfully standing upon G-d's Promises in spite of world opinion. This is a vigorous religious tour that will effectively challenge "palestine" Liberation Organization propaganda, anti-Semitism, and historical revisionism as it relates to the Jewish People and the Jewish Land.

Project Shofar Christian Branch President Ed Warmoth, whose background is in theology and building, will provide insightful and challenging teachings and G-d is Moving today. His wife, Sandy, the mission's International Coordinator, whose background is in journalism and international relations, will provide material to acquaint participants with historical facts and current events. The volatile political situation necessitates that our tour agenda remain deliberately flexible and open to equally good alternatives that will be conducive to our tour goals.

Upon arriving in the Promised Land, Monday afternoon, March 19th, the group will journey from Tel-Aviv southward to Gush Katif, where we will settle in a local Council will send a speaker to brief the group during dinner about the state of affairs in this flashpoint area.

On Tuesday, the group will spend the day touring the Gush Katif homesteads, industrial projects. We will also meet with some of the local homesteaders.

Wednesday, the group will leave Gush Katif and head for the Judeean Hills. Along the way we will visit a newsworthy homestead on Har Hebron, where we will then travel to Caleb's Inheritance, Kiryat Arba, where Yeshivat Nir Kiryat Arba, also known as the Nir College of Judaic Studies, the home of Project Shofar's Executive Director, Gary M. Cooperberg. During lunch the group will meet with key community religious figures, such as Kiryat Arba's current, historical and Biblical significance of Hebron, will lead the group on an interpretive tour throughout this first Jewish City, bringing dimension to the Hebron area. He will also introduce us to key activists and official representatives of Hebron's Jewish community. Supper will be served at the Yeshiva's dining hall, and

Thursday morning we will demonstrate our unity with our Jewish brethren by working Kiryat Arba, which rose up around Nir College. Rav Waldman, a reserve Captain of an Israel Defense Forces (IDF) tank unit, was among the first to establish the industrial area and winery, new building sites and other places of interest, and the medical center where Gary's wife, Andrea, a nurse, serves her community.

Friday morning the group will depart from Kiryat Arba and travel northwest toward Jerusalem. The first stop along the way will be the Gush Etzion area, which was destroyed from a violent Arab assault during the War of Independence in 1948. We will also visit the city of Efrat with its large Orthodox community, which was destroyed by the PLO in 1994. We will then travel to Bethlehem, and then onto our destination, Jerusalem, so that we can prepare to spend the Sabbath in a centrally located five-star, world-class hotel, with

On Sunday the group will explore the Old City and Greater Jerusalem through the Jewish character of Judaism's holiest City. Key activist figures from this organization will begin the tour from their yeshiva, which remains in the Old City, through the narrow alleyways, courtyards and onto the rooftops of the historical City of Gold, the Ateret Cohanim will take us to Givat Hazzait, known as Mount of Olives.

We will depart from Jerusalem on Monday and travel northward toward the Shomron: Biblical Samaria. Our host this day will be the high-ranking official of the Shomron Regional Council, Ron Nachman. Ariel recently received its status as a city. This is the only city in the West Bank where Arab occupation abounds, and he will give us a detailed briefing on the current and future security problems that the area's homesteaders are dealing with.

Our trip will continue northward toward the Golan Heights on Wednesday morning. We will then shoot up to the northern tip of Israel to check out the situation in Kiryat Shmona and other nearby communities that are situated in Israel's self-declared security zone, established 20 years ago to protect the northern Israeli communities from Islamic-backed Hizb'allah terrorism. After the withdrawal, fled from the Hizb'allah reprisals and from the harsh sentences that the Syrian-controlled Lebanese puppet government imposed on the strategic 2,300-ft. mountain ridge where Israel can see enemy troop movements from every direction. The tour will include a sound and light show of the Golan Heights, Damascus is visible, and a stop at the defense line into Syria. In the evening we will meet with representatives of the Golan Action Committee.

Thursday we continue our tour of the Golan Heights, where beautiful waterfalls grace the rugged terrain and some of the best kosher dining is available. BUILDERS OF ZION HANDS-ON CONSTRUCTION TOUR FACT SHEET

MEETING POINTS & DURATION OF TOUR:

Tour-goers inside the United States will meet at New York's Kennedy Airport on Sunday evening, March 18, 2001. You will be responsible for getting yourself to New York City and back to your hometowns, but reduced-rate flight packages will be available for group members who take flights to Kennedy Airport from Los Angeles, Dallas, Orlando, and Chicago. You will need to arrive five hours early to check in for your international flight, and you are allowed two luggage bags and a carry-on. Anything over this limit will be an extra cost to you. We will board a jumbo jet on Israel's official airline, El Al. Our 12-hour economy class flight will feature great Israeli food and hospitality, and we will fly straight to Tel-Aviv's Ben Gurion Airport, where we will arrive late Monday morning. Once there, we will meet up with Builders of Zion tour-goers from outside the U.S. at the Palm Beach Hotel in Gaza. At the end of our tour, we will depart from the Ben Gurion Airport on Friday, March 30th at 1 a.m., and will arrive that same day at Kennedy Airport.

COST, DEPOSIT & PAYMENTS:

The cost for tour-goers departing from the U.S. will be \$2,500.00. A Land-package costing \$1,600.00 will be available for those joining our tour from other countries. A non-refundable deposit of \$300.00 is due by October 1, 2000. Partial payments will be accepted up until December 1, 2000, and then you must be fully paid up. Ticketing must be completed 45 days prior to our departure; from that period on if you cancel or change your ticket the airline will require from you a cancellation fee.

WHAT IS INCLUDED:

For tour-goers departing from the U.S., the tour package will include all that is described within the Land package below, as well as the airfare out of Kennedy Airport to Ben Gurion Airport and the return trip from the same points. This includes airport taxes and handling fees. In the Land package, tour-goers will be provided with transportation from and to the Ben Gurion Airport. We will tour throughout Israel on air-conditioned buses and vans, and in some areas where heightened security is required, we will take bullet-proof buses. All tour-based land transportation and transfer fees, as well as the fees and tips for the bus drivers will be included in the tour package cost. During your free time, if you require transportation, you will be responsible for paying for it. Tips for our tour guides are included in the cost of the tour package. We will enjoy our Jerusalem stay in a 5-star hotel. Our stay in the Hebron area will be at the Nir College dorms. All other stays in hotels and guesthouses throughout our trip will be 4-star. All rates for sleeping accommodations are done on a half-board basis. If, however, you desire your own separate accommodation, an additional \$300.00 will be added to your tour-package cost. Tips for the hotel bell-hops and housekeepers are included. A full breakfast and dinner each day is included, however you will be buying your own lunch from local homesteaders during our travels. There will be two exceptions: On the Sabbath - Friday sundown to Saturday sundown - there will be specially prepared, pre-packaged meals that will also include lunch and a light Havdalah meal. Also, a special luncheon at the Nir College in Kiryat Arba is included. All of the meals for the duration of the trip will be glatt kosher. Tips for the servers are included, with the exception of when you are buying your own lunches. The tour package includes all entrance fees for the sites that are listed on the itinerary.

LOVE OFFERING:

There will be a love offering specifically for the Nir College of Judaic Studies at Project Shofar's main headquarters in Kiryat Arba. We will take up this offering prior to presenting it at the on-campus solidarity dinner. Please pray about and plan for what the Lord would have you give prior to our arrival in Israel.

WHAT IS NOT INCLUDED:

You will be responsible for your own passport costs and for fees associated with visa requirements and health documentation. The tour package does not include insurance, but comprehensive travel protection will be offered for an additional \$170.00 per adult. Any child under 18 who is accompanied by a traveling family member who purchases this insurance will be fully insured at no extra cost. You will also pay for food and beverages which normally would not be provided with the breakfasts and dinners that are included in the tour package, and you will be responsible for the costs involved with ordering room service, as well as other services of a personal nature. Tips for handling your luggage at airports and for persons who render special services to you that are beyond what is provided for the group will be your responsibility.

REQUIREMENTS & RESPONSIBILITIES:

You must have a valid passport and any necessary inoculations before departing for Israel. If you have health issues, you must discuss these matters with Project Shofar leaders prior to making a down payment for the tour. This is a rigorous tour agenda, and some persons may not be able to participate in some or even all of the tour because of their medical conditions. You will still be required to pay for the entire tour package even if you only participate in part of the tour. Any person who becomes ill or injured during the tour and misses out on part of the activities as a result, or anyone who finds it necessary to depart from the tour at an earlier date other than what is scheduled, that person will not receive a refund for that part of the tour that he or she could not participate in. If you require a special diet, please consult with your Christian or Jewish branch leaders. We will do our best to accommodate your dietary needs within the tour budget, but if this is not possible then you will be responsible for the extra cost involved. Should you decide to take a pre or post sight-seeing tour, you will be responsible for meeting up with or departing from our group. If you opt to take additional excursions during our tour, you will be responsible for meeting up with our group at times that will not disrupt group activities. If you miss any part of our tour because of your extra activities, you will still be required to pay the full cost for the tour package. No children younger than 13 are allowed on the trip, and all children under 18 must at all times be accompanied by an adult.

OTHER TERMS:

Please carefully read this entire brochure before you enroll in and pay for the tour because signing up for this tour package constitutes your full acceptance of the conditions and arrangements set forth herein. Project Shofar and the Nir College of Judaic Studies, both the organizations and their hosts, officers, staff and volunteers, assume no responsibility either corporate or private, before, during or after the Builders of Zion's Hands-on Construction Tour, and this shall cover conditions and reasons occasioned by the following circumstances: liability for any illnesses, injuries, accidents, acts of war, acts of God, damage or loss to person or property, incidental damages, miscellaneous inconveniences and irregularities, delays because of weather or political conditions, and other unforeseen changes in schedules or itinerary. This shall include, and not be limited to default, negligence, or omission on the part of any common or private carrier or by any of their staff and affiliates who provide services or facilities that are related to or included in this religious-educational working tour or any part thereof, or in arranging for the same. This also includes any acts of omissions of the Project Shofar or Nir College of Judaic Studies hosts and officers. The airline or private carrier is not to be held responsible for any act, omission or event during the time the passengers are not on board the airplanes. The passenger contracts in use by the airline or other lines involved when issued, will constitute the sole contract between the airline and the passenger or purchaser of this Builders of Zion Hands-on Construction tour package. Project Shofar and Nir College of Judaic Studies assume no liability or responsibility in connection therewith.
